## What is the Walking School Bus?

A Walking School Bus is a program designed to create a safe and enjoyable way for children to travel to and from school. It involves a group of students walking together under the supervision of dedicated trained adult Walk Leaders, creating a "bus route" that children can join and walk to/from school together. A WSB works similar to a traditional yellow school bus but on foot!
